

Animal Welfare & Environmental Policy

Overview

It is the policy of Goole Training to treat the environment in which we work (and the animals which inhabit this environment) with respect and this policy is written to ensure we comply with our obligations under The Animal Welfare Act 2006.

What we will do

It is the responsibility of Goole Training, its instructors, assessors and learners to ensure that in any training or assessment (and activity prior to, and subsequent to) the following five animal welfare needs are met:

- A suitable environment (place to live)
- A suitable diet which includes fresh water at all times
- Exhibit normal behaviour patterns
- Housing with, or apart from, other animals as required
- Protection from pain, injury, suffering and disease

Risk assessments will be undertaken in advance of the commencement of training or assessments to identify the potential for learners to come into contact with live animals, or cause pollution/damage to the environment, and if identified, precautions will be put in place to reduce the risk of negligence which may have an impact on animal welfare and/or the environment.
